

The Cotton Exchange is on the river in downtown Wilmington and it is where bales of cotton were stored to be exported by ship. Now there are shops and restaurants.




April 23, 2010


Friday

Saturday


Saturday morning we went to the New Hanover Arboretum. It's a

l even made a new friend.





Schoolchildren helped make the mosaics that were used for a low wall and as stepping stones.






Outside the chapel was a fountain that was just my size for

Once we got to the beach it was great. We had lots of fun playing in the water and the sand. There was a wind blowing and I had a hard time standing up.




We had lunch on the beach and then went walking and looking for seashells. We got to stay at the beach a long time.
